## A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY

A proposal to 'prepare documentation recording the Parish's history to date and establish an archive of historical information' was approved by the Parish Pastoral Council in January 2018. A small team of parishioners was formed. Led by Michael Taylor, the team includes Kerry Hardwick, Judy Priestly, Josie Staude, Marianne Taylor, Tony Bray and parish archivist Lucia Steeman.

The team has been gathering data, indexing historical material, conducting interviews and collecting information from parishioners through a questionnaire. They now have a significant amount of information and over the next few months will write material based on subjects that are of interest. All material produced will be in digital form and available on the Parish web site.

Parish history begins with the establishment of St Columba's Parish in South Perth in 1917. With slow growth South of the river until after the Second World War, the Kensington, Como and Manning suburbs were originally part of the St Columba's Parish. The establishment of the church schools which used to exist on Carey Street in Kensington (opened in 1938) and Thelma Street in Como (opened in 1953) occurred while Kensington and Como were part of St Columba's Parish.

As the population increased, the Holy Cross Kensington Parish was formed in 1950 and the Holy Family Como Parish in 1955. Kensington used the school hall until their church was opened in November 1964 and Como used a number of venues until their church was opened in April 1959. Pictures of the two churches are below.

With the appointment of the Blessed Sacrament Fathers in 1985, the Holy Cross Kensington and Holy Family Como Parishes were amalgamated. The two parishes continued to function under amalgamated conditions until the Blessed Sacrament Fathers left Perth in December 1998. It was then that the Parish of Kensington was closed, with all its facilities and the Como Parish became the Como-Kensington Parish. The Parish we have to-day has three stories, the Kensington story, the Como story and the Holy Family Como-Kensington story.

It is important we record and acknowledge these stories so that we can appreciate the efforts of our earlier parish communities and clergy. Their achievements were considerable; and we continue to benefit from their efforts. The parish church has also been an important commitment for many of our older parishioners and the story of a number of families over several generations remind us of what is important in to-days rapidly changing world.

As part of Holy Family Church's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in April 2009, there was a one-page history article prepared by Ken Kelsall. There are also brief histories included in the original church blessing booklets. Previously a number of people have provided oral histories. There is a need to bring this all together and it is planned that the History Team will publish an informative and interesting story by Christmas this year

# GREETINGS FROM FROSSIE

Dear parishioners and friends,

I take this opportunity to share with you a thought from our beloved Pope Francis.

First of all I would like to thank you most sincerely for your commitment in the service of our Church and particularly of our parish. This church and this parish is the Mystical body of Christ. It is very attractive to think of this parish as a small-scale model of the church, in other words as a body which strives seriously every day to work harmoniously, head, hands and legs in unison. In fact, as a dynamic body it cannot live without a vital, personal, authentic and solid relationship with Christ and one another.

To this end, Pope Francis give us, two exhortations:

Firstly, the need for coordination: Once its members lose communion among themselves, the body loses its harmonious functioning and its

equilibrium: its members do not work together and lose the spirit of fellowship and teamwork. When the foot says to the arm: "I don't need you" or the hand says to the head, "I am in charge" they create discomfort and scandal.

Secondly, gossiping, grumbling and back-biting is a grave illness which begins simply in small talk and takes over a person, making him become a "sower of weeds" and in many cases, a cold-blooded killer of the good name of our colleagues and confreres, and so let us be on our guard against the terrorism of gossip.

He concludes by saying that it is the Holy Spirit of God who makes us realise that every member participates in the sanctification of the Body of Christ. It is He who brings about the harmony and unity of all the members.

And so, let us devote ourselves to ardent prayer to the Holy Spirit so as to grow in the love of God, his Church and one another.

**Parish Management** 

At Holy Family Parish, Como we are an active Christ centred community. Many subcommittees support Fr Ossie in promoting Gospel values and the teachings of the Church. The Parish is well supported by two pastoral assistants, Nola Smith and Tony Pires. They dutifully assist Father in leading the mission and pastoral care of the parish community. The Pastoral Council also assists Fr Ossie to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love, values and teachings of Christ in our world. The newly realised Archdiocesan constitution is mandated by the Archbishop of Perth and provides regulations for the operation of the Council as a body of persons to carry out activities as specified. We look forward to working closely with other Parishes to meet the challenges of the new Archdiocesan constitution. The Parish Finance Committee also works within this constitution in offering sound advice to the parish priest on financial matters related to Parish funds.

Behind the scenes there are many people who support the smooth running of our Parish. Office staff are available each day of the week to handle inquires and liaise with Fr Ossie. Our two Safeguarding Officers are responsible for ensuring the safety of children, young people and the vulnerable within our Parish. The Maintenance Coordinator keeps a check on our ageing Church and premises. A recent initiative for the Parish has been an upgrade of the solar panels for a more energy efficient return. Ongoing maintenance is underway in the Church and hall. Recently a hazardous tree was removed from behind the Parish centre. Our Grounds Coordinator dutifully works with and oversees the volunteer workers on a Saturday morning to upgrade our gardens and keep them looking neat and tidy.

#### Spiritually

Our altar servers, acolytes, lectors, extraordinary ministers, children's liturgy team, sacred environment team, liturgy committee and small Christian communities all contribute to the development of our catholic faith within the Parish and are a visible sign of our Christ centred, faithful Church. Their devotion in carrying out their roles displays commitment to serving God as we gather in worship. The liturgical year of 2018 has been identified by the Australian Bishops as a National Year of Youth. At Holy Family Parish the youth meet monthly with Fr Ossie to focus on practical ways to deepen their faith and be active within the Catholic faith community as they live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today.

#### Evangelisation

The Parish sacramental program prepares children for the celebration of the sacraments. The parish supports the family to provide a home environment that promotes the growth of faith for all their family members and leads them into celebrating the faith-life of the parish community especially through their participation in the Mass. Catechists also take weekly Children's Liturgy sessions during the Sunday masses to bring children closer to Jesus and his teachings in the Gospel. Adult faith enrichment sessions are hosted by the Parish to facilitate a deeper understanding of the Catholic faith and Church teachings. Holy Family is hosting three Plenary Council discussions looking at the future of the Church in Australia. Parishioners are encouraged to attend and share their thoughts and experiences. #### Social Outreach Services

The Vinnies Como Conference services people in need in Como, Kensington, South Perth, Manning and Karawara. They offer assistance to their clients through food, fuel, clothing, bedding and furniture vouchers. The Holy Family Parish give generously to collections for the Vinnies and support the Christmas Giving Tree. The Holy Family Parish operates Holy Family Care which offers assistance to parishioners for short term home help, handyman jobs, transport, gardening and emergency meals. The Parish supports appeals locally, Nationally and Internationally through Caritas, Lifelink and Catholic Missions Propagation of the Faith Appeal. Parishioners are generous with donations and their time given to people in need.

## Social and fundraising activities

Social and fundraising events are offered within the Parish. Parishioners offer both monetary and organisational support to ensure the success of these activities.

#### **Parish Initiatives**

During 2018 a small team of parishioners headed by Michael Taylor have begun a Parish History Project. Another initiative taken up by the Parish Pastoral Council has to been to update the appearance and content of the parish website. This project is presently underway and will be finalised in the near future.

#### Our future

As Catholics we are challenged to be attentive to the realities of life within society and to work together to search for where God may be leading. It is important that we gather, pray and share our thoughts and listen to one another. The Catholic Church in Australia is undergoing change. We have an opportunity through The Plenary Council to respond and be disciples of this renewal and change.

Sacred places are the places we encounter everyday.





"You don't have to especially

Take turns to listen to each other as you share your personal experience of faith,



## VINNIES - FESTIVAL MASS



On Sunday 24th June, Holy Family Parish Como hosted the St Vincent de Paul Annual Festival Mass for the Queens Park Region, comprising Conferences in the south eastern suburbs of the Perth Metropolitan area. The purpose of the Festival Mass is to commission new members and new Conference Presidents.

The commissioning ceremony was conducted by Como Parish Priest Fr Ossie Lewis, while new members and Presidents were introduced by Ms Barbara Boggan, the Queens Park Regional President and welcomed by Mrs Gladys Demissie, Vinnies' new State President.

Ten new members were commissioned of whom seven were from the Como Conference. Two new conference Presidents, from Armadale and Riverton Conferences, were also commissioned.



## Soul and body: "the Me within me"

In a venerable synagogue in Prague, there is a display of paintings and drawings by children. It's a lovely exhibit - until you realize that the children who created these pictures all perished in the Holocaust.

There is one sketch in the exhibit that is especially evocative. It was drawn by a ten-year-old boy named Frantisek Brozan. Frantisek's picture is a simple line drawing of a man with striped



pants. He has two eyes, a dot for a nose, a moustache and a hat - but no mouth or arms. It seems like an expression of helplessness: no way to speak, no arms to reach out. But inside the torso of the man, Frantisek drew another man - and, if you look carefully, you can see it's that same man.

What is this man within the man?

In the display, there is card placed next to the picture. The picture is titled Soul and Body

Rabbi Naomi Levy saw the picture on a trip to Prague and was deeply affected by it. She writes in her book Einstein and the Rabbi: Searching for the Soul, that the picture shows that "even in hell the soul can create beauty":

"Frantisek asked us to see the soul with new eyes. I think he was saying the soul is the 'Me within me.' "


It is the truest version of Me.
