



R OF YOUTH - AUSTRAI



The liturgical year of 2018 has been identified by the Australian Bishops as a national Year of Youth. This is an exciting opportunity on the life of the church to focus on young people and see how we as a church can better engage with them.

The theme of 2018 Year of Youth is "Open New Horizons for Spreading Joy: Young People, Faith & Vocational Discernment" and has three main goals:

Goal 1: TO FOSTER the total personal and spiritual growth of each young person - The Church is challenged to foster in young people a sense of Catholic wisdom and identity that will provide a guiding direction for the rest of their lives. As a community, parish and family we are called to work together as a broader Church community to walk with young people on their faith journey. Goal 2: TO DRAW young people into responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic faith community - Faith communities should strive to be places that draw in young people, give them a sense of belonging, and offering them opportunities to minister side by side with adults.

Goal 3: TO EMPOWER young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today -We the Church parishes, communities, schools and families, are called to reach out to young people, welcome them, help them find their place in the Church, and accept and encourage the gifts they bring to the whole community. Without young people, the Body of Christ is incomplete. At Holy Family Parish, Como we held a Year of Youth Launch Mass on Saturday 3rd February. At

this Mass youth were involved in all aspects of the liturgy including Music Ministry, Serving at the Altar, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist and the Proclamation of the Word. We look forward to the next Youth Mass on Saturday 21st April. Youth are invited to join Fr Ossie after the Mass for a 'Curry Night' and informal discussion on family.

During the Holy Thursday Mass youth participated in the enactment of the 'washing of the feet'. It was heartening to see young people actively involved in the example of 'faith in action' as they 'served' each other by washing their feet. We are progressing well with the three goals of **BREDA PIRES &** the Year of Youth.



PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

MARIE TILEY

The Parish Pastoral Council has begun the year with a shared vision and clear direction from our Parish Mission statement. We strive to build a parish structure that embraces each of us and enables us to work collaboratively to serve God. Already this year we have sought direction from the Archdiocese regarding strengthening and revitalising our Parish. We eagerly await the release of the Parish Council Constitution to increase the level of understanding of the role of Parish Pastoral Councillors and parish leaders as to how to effectively meet the needs of the community.

The Year of Youth was launched in our Parish in early February with a Youth Mass followed by a sausage sizzle. A group of young parishioners are coming together, sharing their faith and working within the Christian community as we move towards Church renewal.

A Parish History Project has begun with a committed team documenting our parish history. Michael Taylor, Kerry Hardwick, Lucia Steeman, Tony Bray and Parish Councillor, Marianne Taylor have met to plan how this will look and proceed throughout 2018.

Tony Pires, one of our Pastoral Assistant, will facilitate an Adult Faith Enrichment session on Saturday 7th April after the 6pm Mass. Everyone in the Parish is invited to gather and share your thoughts and beliefs of our Catholic faith to deepen the appreciation of God's people and strengthen our community of faith.

'Jesus and the Church are like two sides of the one coin: you can't have one side without having the other as well." (Archbishop Timothy Costelloe). Jesus chose a community of disciples to follow him and this community is what the Church is made up of. This community comprises each and everyone one of us working to spread the Gospel of Jesus through our interaction with others in our daily lives.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM MARK FERROA

Our 2018 Sacramental Preparation Program commenced on the weekend of 17/18 February when children who enrolled in our Sacramental program, together with their parents, presented themselves at the altar during mass and, before Fr Ossie, prayed a prayer of commitment to their Sacramental preparation.

The First Reconciliation program started a week later on Sunday 25 February. This program is on-going and, so far, parents have attended a Parent Meeting with the catechists, and the children have attended a Rite of Commitment Mass, which was held on 11 March. The Mass was well attended by the families. Classes will continue to be held on Sundays at 10am and the children will be making their first confession on Saturday 23 June. The catechists for our First Reconciliation program are Ellen Miller and Clare Burke.

We are currently preparing for the start of our First Eucharist and Pre Confirmation classes, both of which will be conducted during the second school term.

Meanwhile, there have been a few changes in our team of catechists who carry out our Sacramental program. One of our longest-serving catechists, Sonia Tay, will be moving interstate in the near future and she will be missed by all of us. Another of our catechists, Trish Candeias, is leaving the sacramental program to focus on our ever popular Children's Liturgy program. On behalf of our parish, we would like to thank Sonia and Trish for their contribution to our Sacramental program. We warmly welcome Ellen Miller, Joni Wijaya and Stephanie Johnson who have so generously responded to our invitation to join our team of catechists. Ellen has already taken charge of our First Reconciliation class, while Stephanie and Joni will join other catechists to teach in our First Eucharist and Confirmation classes.

And we will continue to have Marie Tiley, Clare Burke, Nola Smith and Mark Ferroa in our team of catechists. We would like to thank Marie and Clare for their many years of service, preparing so many children for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation.

Important dates and times for the 2018 Sacramental Preparation program:

The First Reconciliation program started Sunday 25 February. Classes are held on Sundays from 10.00am to 11.00am.

The First Eucharist program will start on Saturday 5 May. Classes will be held on Saturdays from 4.45pm to 5.45pm.

The Pre Confirmation program starts on Saturday 5 May. Classes will be held on Saturdays from 4.45pm to 5.45pm. The program finishes on Saturday 23 June.

The Confirmation program will start on Saturday 21 July. Classes will be held on Saturdays from 4.45pm to 5.45pm.

YR5 PRE-CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME

A new **Pre Confirmation** program for children in year five has been incorporated into our parish sacramental preparation program this year. Our sacramental classes will now be organised as follows:

Year 3	First Reconciliation
Year 4	First Eucharist
Year 5	Pre Confirmation
Year 6	Confirmation

The Pre Confirmation program has been introduced to help children develop a better understanding of our faith in readiness for the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is mandatory for all children to complete the Pre Confirmation program before they can enrol in our Confirmation preparation program.

The topics covered in the Pre Confirmation program include:

- 1. The Seven Sacraments
- 2. Leaders of the Faith Community the Church
- 3. Continuing the Mission of Jesus
- 4. The Apostles Creed
- 5. Preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 6. The Saints

What the introduction of this program does for our parish in practice is to fill a gap in our sacramental preparation program where children, after receiving the Sacrament of First Eucharist in year four, do not attend any classes until they are in year six when they prepare for Confirmation. These children will now attend the seven-week Pre Confirmation program when they are in year five.

This year, our Pre Confirmation program will be conducted for two groups of children:

- Children who will attend Pre Confirmation in 2018 and Confirmation in 2019, and
- 2. Children who will attend **both** Pre Confirmation and Confirmation in 2018.



How have we grown as people of Christian Love?




We understand the Church as the community of Jesus' Followers.

CHURCH WORKERS SAFEGUARDING TRAINING

For all those involved in church work within the Perth Catholic Archdiocese

The Catholic Archdiocese of Perth's Safeguarding Program is child focused and is committed to the principle that children have an absolute right to physical, spiritual and psychological safety at all times and that the Church as a Christian institution should now, and in the future, be in the forefront of efforts to make this a reality.

The Safeguarding Program has been included as a key element of the Archbishop's Archdiocesan Plan. The program's framework includes 12 standards for creating a child safe church. Training and support for those who work with children and vulnerable adults has been identified as a vital component of the Program.

Creating a child-safe church is a dynamic process that involves active participation and responsibility by all Clergy, church workers and the wider church community. This is made possible by collaboration, vigilance and proactive approaches across policies, procedures and practices.

AS a volunteer/church worker within the Archdiocese, it is paramount that you are familiar with the Safeguarding Program and how it impacts on your role.

- The role of the Parish Safeguarding Officer
- Safeguarding and my role within the parish
- Beyond the Royal Commission



We sing joyfully "Alleluia, alleluia" as we thank God for Easter morning.



Oz Rosary #53 There are 53 Hail Mary's in the Rosary

In October 2017, more than one million lay people gathered in 53 locations around Poland to pray for the protection of their country and to intercede for their young people.

Ireland then followed with well over thirty thousand lay people gathering at fifty three locations around the country to pray the rosary.

After Ireland, Italy's coastal parishes organised the reciting of the rosary in 53 locations. England and France are currently organising their own big rosary events on the 28th and 29th April respectively.


Easter: The Resurrection of the Lord

Allelula:

"You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here." (Mark 16: 1-7)

Easter change

Leaving school on that Wednesday afternoon, he heard the shots and ducked for cover with other students. **All the shootings** he had read and heard about at other schools were now horrifyingly real. When it was over, he and his schoolmates left their Florida high school changed. A new awareness, a new sense of compassion for others, took hold within them all. These young men and women - no longer kids - vowed that this would not happen to another high school.



She had kept quiet, taking in stride the crude comments, the demeaning jokes, the "accidental" touching because that is what women were expected to do, if they wanted to keep their jobs. But the women across the country who spoke up against such sexual harassment and abuse inspired her. She finally saw herself as more than her job. She realized that she was a woman deserving of dignity and respect.

They are almost too many to count. **Thousands die every year** from opioid overdoses. She was going to be among that number. Then she found out that she was four months pregnant - and that her baby would be born addicted. "My baby's going to feel withdrawal because of my choices - knowing that she's going to feel pain because of my actions is horrible." That was enough for her to seek help. Her daughter was born in January. Baby is doing beautifully - mother is getting there.

Easter is about resurrection - not just resuscitation, - not just about coming back from the brink, - not just about bouncing back from a difficult situation, - not just about a near miss when we've been spared the worst that can happen.

<u>In fact, the pre-requisite for resurrection is that the worst - devastating loss and death - happens. And we are changed by the experience.</u>

Easter's empty tomb is the blessed hope that the Good Fridays of grief and devastation that we all experience are not the end, but can lead to new, refocused and transformed lives. The "nail marks" do not disappear or are forgotten, but God's wisdom and compassion take hold in our souls. And we are changed.

The empty tomb of Easter morning is God's promise: that no tomb can contain the mercy and hope of God.

May we be about the work of Easter: to unlock the music of God's peace in our lives that has for too long been entombed by fear, anger and hurt.
