The Liturgy of the Word

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

FIRST READING Wisdom 9:13-18

What man indeed can know the intentions of God? Who can divine the will of the Lord? The reasonings of mortals are unsure and our intentions unstable; for a perishable body presses down the soul, and this tent of clay weighs down the teeming mind. It is hard enough for us to work out what is on earth, laborious to know what lies within our reach; who, then, can discover what is in the heavens? As for your intention, who could have learnt it, had you not granted Wisdom and sent you holy spirit from above? Thus have the paths of those on earth been straightened and men been taught what pleases you, and saved, by Wisdom.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

R. In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

SECOND READING Philemon 9-10,12-17 This is Paul writing, an old man now and, what is more, still a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for a child of mine, whose father I became while wearing these chains: I mean Onesimus. I am sending him back to you and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave anymore, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood- brother as well as a brother in the Lord.


GOSPEL Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish". Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for

So, in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.

As a result of the new decree. The announcements in mass & publication of mass offerings for the parish have changed. "The Book of the Names of the Dead" is a liturgical book used in many parishes to honor & remember deceased parishioners by recording their names. The parish has purchased this book which will be available mid September.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel begins with Jesus' seemingly shocking words to the crowds following him, 'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple'. The word 'hate' in this passage is an example of prophetic hyperbole which possibly shocks the modern listener more than those to whom Jesus spoke. The crowds may well have been familiar with the loving/hating idiom in use at that time. 'Hate' in this context does not indicate a directive from Jesus to despise or reject anyone. It is used here to dramatically describe the necessity for disciples to choose to prefer to give their loyalty to following Jesus above everything else. In the final line of the Gospel, Luke reports Jesus saying: 'None of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions'. It seems safe to assume, therefore, that the people in these crowds have possessions to give up! They may have been quite wealthy. For those of higher status following Jesus on that day - or in the community for whom Luke is writing - the summons to discipleship could have proved very costly. As disciples of Jesus, we might be prepared to accept the challenge to give up at least some of our possessions or spend less time on activities which are addictive. We might plan to overcome our greed, hoarding, habits of displaying expensive possessions to impress others, and overconsumption of food and goods. We could decide to respond in this way to enable us to share more of our time with others, to share our abundance, to help eliminate poverty, even to more fully embrace recycling,
