The Liturgy of the Word

#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON**

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

FIRST READING Isaiah 66:18-21

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

#### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM**

R. Go out to all the world and tell the Good News.

SECOND READING Hebrews 12:5-7.11-13 Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

Through towns and villages he went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because I tell you, many will try to enter and not succeed. 'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from". Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!" Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God. Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

This week we have another difficult passage from Luke, difficult in that it has layers of rejection and exclusion mounted within it. Perhaps it is best to begin from both ends of our passage. The opening setting is Jesus on his 'way' to Jerusalem. This turn to Jerusalem is a code in the Gospels revealing the threat of the Passion within his ministry itself. In a sense for Jesus the way of the Cross has begun. The final verses open up to the early Christians the horizon of discipleship. The Christian community is comprised of followers from every corner of the earth. You can see here the implicit reference to the first reading from Isaiah in which all the nations come to the mountain of the Lord. The message is that the last person you thought might enter the reign may well be the first to be allowed in.

In between these two bookends are some strong reminders for the followers of Jesus. Belonging has consequences for the way we live and the way we understand our place within the reign of God. It is not enough to be proximate to Jesus, standing in the shadow of the streets he walks and the meals he shares. It is to take up that walk to Jerusalem, to recognise that there will be struggle, and to respond in fidelity. Nor is it sufficient to be complacent in light of heritage. It is not enough to know about the master of the house or be able to recognise Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Something more is needed, and that is gleaned from the Gospel as a whole: to love. Jesus is challenging us to action rather than to identity, with the Cross in the background as a menacing motif. Jesus turns to Jerusalem out of love and obedience, and knows it is a costly journey. The passage from the prophet Isaiah carries much of this theme. The chosen people cannot be complacent because God can call from amongst all the peoples, who will attest the divine glory. The full chapter 66 from which our section is excised reminds Israel of the need to be faithful to God, and the temptation to only offer lip service. It also serves to remind them that the glory of God is not limited to one group, and certainly not to those whose worship is on the surface.

The glory of God is for all! The lection from the Letter to the Hebrews follows its own separate course. Building from last week's second reading, it reminds the community to endure. Their endurance and healing are a form of parental discipline, strengthening for what could come and encouraging them to embrace their current difficulties. It seems that the community requires some resilience training.
