The Liturgy of the Word

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Romans 10:8-13

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: "My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians illtreated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'

On the positive side it says: The word, that is the faith we proclaim, is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips your are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction

between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

GOSPEL Luke 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf'. But Jesus replied, "Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone'. Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone'. Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said to him `throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put angels in charge of you to guard you,' and again, 'They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone'. But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test'. Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.

FATHER DAT'S PILGRIMAGE BLOG

While Father Dat is away, he will be sending through a blog on his pilgrimage journey which will be in the bulletin each week.

Week two - Traveling in a group of 8 pilgrims through narrow streets of Hanoi, Da Nang, Hue, and Hoi An, sums up the northern half of Vietnam. Highlights from pilgrims are the daily Morning and Evening Prayers in one of our pilgrim's room, a Mass in Vietnamese of a church in Hue, despite difference in a foreign language, the same liturgy allowed complete engagement with the whole Liturgy of singing and the homily. Most memorable among pilgrims was our private Ash Wednesday Mass at Our Lady of La Vang, a miraculous apparition dated back in the 1700s, still brings great peace and faith to the many who come and visit here, while standing underneath an old ruin bell tower to finish off the tour, the bell rang with melody, inspiring us all to pray the Angelus. Looking forward to Hoi An, and already some pilgrims are undergoing deep spiritual reawakening from within their hearts.

GOSPEL REFLECTON

The Gospel of the Liturgy today, takes us into the desert, where Jesus is led by the Holy Spirit, for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. Jesus too was tempted by the devil, and He accompanies us, every one of us, in our temptations. The desert symbolizes the fight against the seductions of evil. Indeed, Jesus lives the experience of the desert just before beginning his public mission. It is precisely through this spiritual combat that he decisively affirms what type of Messiah he intends to be. Not this type of Messiah, but that one: I would say that this is indeed the declaration of Jesus' messianic identity, the messianic way of Jesus. "I am the Messiah, but on this path". Twice the devil addresses him, saying: "If you are the Son of God..." He is thus proposing to him to exploit his position. First to satisfy the material needs he feels, hunger, then to increase his power, and, finally, to have a prodigious sign from God. Three temptations. It is as if he were saying, "If you are Son of God, take advantage of it!".

But Jesus opposes the attractions of evil in a winning way. How does he do this? By responding to temptations with the Word of God, which says not to take advantage, not to use God, and things for oneself, not to take advantage of one's own position to obtain privileges. Because true happiness and freedom are not found in possessing, but in sharing; not in taking advantage, but in loving them; not in the obsession of power, but in the joy of service. These temptations also accompany us on the journey of life. We must be vigilant, do not be afraid, it happens to everyone, and be vigilant, because they often present themselves under an apparent form of good. In fact, the devil, who is cunning, always uses deception. He wanted Jesus to believe that his proposals were useful to prove that he was really the Son of God. And he does so with us too: he often arrives "with sweet eyes", "with an angelic face"; he even knows how to disguise himself with sacred, apparently religious motives! May this time of Lent be a time of the desert for us. Let us take time for silence and prayer, let us stop and look at what is stirring in our hearts, that which we know cannot be justified.

The puzzle is based on Luke 4:1-13 (NIV).

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


1st SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR C
