The Liturgy of the Word

### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON**

I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.

# **FIRST READING**

Ezekiel 47:1-2. 8-9. 12

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, sin the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round the outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the righthand side. The man went to the east holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he them made a wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across the stream again; the water reached my knees. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand; it was now a river which I could not cross; the stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said. "Do you see, son of man?" He took me further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. He said, 'This water flows east down to Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'

For the foundation, nobody can lay any other that the one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ. Didn't you realize that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the Temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

# GOSPEL John 2:13-22

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeons-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said. 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered. 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied. 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

In the Gospel we have a strong 'anti-temple' theme, something at odds with the feast being celebrated. And it is a Johannine passage celebrating the dedication of John (the Evangelist) Lateran. For Jesus, no matter how historical and divinely mandated a building, the Temple must hold true to its place as the Father's house. The true Temple is the body of the resurrected Christ, the community of believers we know as the Church. There is a rich irony in this set of biblical passages. The importance of a central place is at play in the first reading, and this is picked up in the history of the Lateran Basilica and the ongoing celebration of the feast. Yet the Basilica is only of the reign of God (Basil has the meaning of King) when it serves the Gospel. This matches the sense in Paul that the faithful are authentic temples of God. The story of Jesus overturning the temple marketplace picks up the irony of the Lateran as a centre of patrician and imperial power, now at the service of the Gospel as the 'mother' church of Christianity. Together our readings celebrate the dedication of the Basilica and offer a cautionary tale from

Jesus himself.


